



SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Any parent or spectator that receives a technical foul or disrupts the game of play will automatically be disqualified from watching the remainder of play for the weekend. Play will be stopped until the parent removes themselves from the facility and failure to do so will result in automatic forfeit of team from that game and all remaining games for the tournament.

Along with the dismissal, the penalty is 5 POINTS, plus possession of the ball back to the other team with sideline out of bounds at half court, across from the scorer's table.

The technical foul is assigned to the head coach. Two technical fouls assigned to the head coach follows the high school league rules of disqualification of that head coach for the remainder of that game, AND WILL ALSO BE FOR the next game of play.

All spectators, coaches, and people attending the tournament/league are expected to represent themselves as a positive role model for the student-athletes. Any disruption on the premises (which includes the parking lot, hallways, and all areas of the facility) will result in disciplinary action against the individual(s) which could include suspension of the team, and termination of the individual(s) from watching the remainder of the tournament. Failure to conform will result in contacting of the authorities in the jurisdiction to enforce this code of conduct.

SCORERS TABLE GUIDELINES

When parents are volunteering with the scorebook or clock, the High School guidelines are followed. Each person involved is responsible for conducting themselves in an impartial manner. All communication with the officials and coaching staff must be directed in a manner that assists with the management of the game. Violation of clock or scorebook personnel results in a warning for first violation, and technical foul for second violation. If a technical foul is issued, the person is removed from the scorer's table area and must be replaced by another volunteer from the team.
